I have your letter of the 7th. in regard to draughtsman, also your telegram of the same date. In accordance with the latter, I telegraphed to Capt. Draper at Seattle, at the address given, but received no reply from him. It might be that the amount mentioned in my telegram, as a compensation to be paid for these services, is too small to prove an inducement to anybody to come here. At the same time, it may have influenced you so that you did not feel at liberty to make an arrangement at a higher rate.
