Operative noticed a man by the name of Wallace, (xx), at Gem on the 29th. Balch, Hendricks and he had a very long talk. Wallace went to Burke, that night. Operative has also noticed Burnside, ex S.B. around at all times, generally in the Jews' Dance House.

Sampson (x) and Laube (x), contractors at the F. & H. mine, were seen drinking a good deal on the evening of the 29th. Sampson was talking about his work, and said he would make \$200 this month, after which he did not care what became of the mines in the Corder d'Alencos.

Operative has noticed a man, Leonard, who is said to be a shareholder in the Mammoth mine. He was showing the blanks from the Intelligence Office in Wallace, and drinking and talking a good deal.

There has been no regular meeting of the Miners' Union since Nov. 18th.
