

Frisco Cons'd Mining Co.

Some of the old timers are expressing themselves very freely about his conduct, saying that he undermined McLeod, who used to be foreman at the Hunter, and that he does all he can against the old timers, but that he cannot do very much as the management does not concur with him.

Sam Cassidy is still in Gem. He talks of going to Butte in the near future.

The Cornishmen at Gem think that Tom Jay is to have charge of the Frisco Mine. Many of them hope so, as he is a Cornishman and they say that he would get rid of the Missourians, and put the Cornishmen to work, many of whom are idle around Gem.

The Unions of the Couer d'Alenes are talking of holding a convention to discuss the new developments: Tom Heney is their champion. James Bamford and James Sheeche are suggesting that the best way to do now, would be to get rid of Edminson, as he knows the old timers too well, and thereby make the position of foreman an unenviable one.
