Operator reports:-

Miners Union meeting. There were twelve members present. The following officers for the ensuing year were elected :-Malcolme Campbell, President; Albert Dolan, V. Pres.; Victor Price Financial Secretary: Martin Davis, Recording Secretary; James Adams, John Bell, Albert Richards, and Joseph Bowers, Trustees. The Treasurer reported \$550. on hand. Aside from the election of Officers no business whatever was transacted at the meetingand the meeting was soon afterwards adjourned . After the meeting an interview was held with Jack Elliott in which he stated that a year and a half of Stewrnberg's war and permit system had failed to drive all the old union miners out of this country although man the mine owners' object was to accomplish that purpose. That many of the old union men succeeded for a time in getting a permit but as their identity became known and the permit black list was perfected, their permits were revoked. The men then resorted to treachery and market deceit and procured permits under assumed names and in other ways. Andrew Leonard of Mace has just been ordered to leave the country under penalty of death if he fails to comply. He has a permit under the name of "Tom Leonard" and is known as "Tom" by all newcomers . Several attempts have been made by deputies and "law and order" thugs at Mace to run foul of him but he has eluded his enemies who openly declare that they will "do for him" on account of his being a union man and not afraid to stand up for his convictions. Leonard has been rooming ever the Senate Saloon at Mace and on Monday night. Dec. 31st, he took in the Redmen's Ball at Burkeand the next day when he put on his working clothes he found a slip fastened to his coat which read as follows"

or we will make you, One and All . Death Committee .

from getting into trouble and that Mike O'Grady is up at Burke and that he (Elliett) was going up there tomorrowto investigate affairs.
