M I N E R S' M E E T I N G .

Operator reports that since the first of this month twenty-three members have left the Wardner Union . The union men are disgusted with this Camp . They say there is no use trying to do anything in the Couer de Alenes.

Communications read last night at the union meeting from Ed. Boyce of Butte City ,Mont. in answer to letter written to him by Secy. of Wardner Union in regard to admitting the Industrial Union men . He says "keep all of them out that have anything to do with the Industrial Unions as he has found out by experience that there are a great many of these men who are doing underhand work to the Western Federation of Miners. He also advised the Wardner Union to be very careful who they admitted into the union.

Outside of this communication received from Boyce there was no other business transacted at the miners' union meeting . It was voted not to admit any of the Industrial union men into the union.

Red Stratton, Jack Bell and John Cauley told operator yesterday that it is a sure thing that Gov. Hunt will call off the martial law very soon "and then some of us old miners stand a show for the Companies will do what is right when they see that they have not everything their own way ."
