

Wallace, Idaho, May 14, 1901.

Opr. reports:

That he visited, the Wallace Hotel Bar, with Arthur Wallace yesterday evening, and in the conversation, Wallace told Opr. that he had been in Montana, and while there Deputy Sheriff Williams came over there, and the boys ordered Williams out of town, and he get out.

He said that if Williams had not get out when ordered, he would have been mobed, also that the Deputies in the Coeur D' Alenes would have a hard time when they left here, as they were spotted by all the Union men.

While Wallace and Opr. was on the street, Deputy Sheriff Sam Finley passed along and spoke to Wallace, Wallace grew nervous when Finley spoke to him, and had to have a drink right off, he said that if ever he meets Finley any where out side of the Coeur D' Alenes, he would make a riddle of his skin, and it would only be a matter of time, when Finley will have to leave town, and then he will get him, if some of the others don't get him first.

Wallace is of the opinion that Finley will not be bothered while in the Coeur D' Alenes.

Wallace asked Opr. if he had seen the Sheriffs dogs, or knew for sure that he had any here now, he said that he would like to know for sure where they were, and said that some one should kill them.

Opr. was at Gem during the afternoon, and while in Henry Connelys place, he told Opr that Jee McDonald was dead, and asked Opr. to take a drink now with the hope that before the end of the year, Burbridge, Campbell, Southerland and his whole gang will follow old Jee and then we would see good times here again.

Connely said, that Martin Moon X X X , came into his place yesterday and made a lot of threats and hammered his gun on the bar, and that he slipped out of the Saleen and got McKay and teek the man right out side on the street, Connely said that he thought McKay was all right and would keep the peace there now.
