

Sunday May 19th-

After the Ball Game was over between Wallace and Mullan, 43 old timers got into Larry Dooleys Saloon, and had four kegs of beer, some one started the Piabo and Jack Thomas (X X)Mammoth Mine and the Assayer at the Morning Mill (A slender man of Dark Complexion, 32 years old, 120 lbs light suit of clothes) got to singing and a Deputy came into the house, and as soon as Jack Thomas saw him, and the song was over, they all started a Bull-pen song, and other patriotic songs of the Coeur D'Alenes.

Some of the Missourians were in the Saloon at the time and made a rush for the door in a hurry, Opr was with Arthur Wallace and asked him about the Assayer who was singing, Wallace said he did not know his name, but he was supposed to be the right kind of a man, in regard to organize labor.

Monday Morning May 20.

Mike Walsh X X X and Andy Hagerman packed a couple of horses and went out prospecting, the horses were packed very light, but they had three good rifles and each carried a 45 Colts revolver, they also had several boxes of cartridges.

Opr. remarked to Walsh that they were well supplied, and Walsh replied that this was a perculiar climate, and a man could never tell how much ammunition he would need, but could always tell as to the amount he would eat.

At noon on Sunday Opr. and Arthur Wallace were eating dinner at Pat Conelys Restaurant and a conversation came up in regard to the blowing up of the Mill in 1899, Wallace remarked that he was caught in one Jack-pot and would never be caught in another, the next time any thing came up he would never destroy property, or rather be accused of it, and that there was only one way to do such things and that was to remove those who stood in the way.
