Dear Sir,-

I do not think we could get right of way for a flume line across the land of the Empire State Co. or Jacovetta. As I mentioned yesterday, I am under the impression that the latter has greed to sell his land to the Empire State Co. when he obtains title. If we were to make any arrangement with Sweeny to give him right of way for his flume, from the South Fork, across our land, in exchange for right of way across his, I think he would be gaining more than we should. I think it quite probable that he would be willing to make such a deal, so as to get the right of way he wants, and then, if we started to take the water from Government Gulch, he would enjoin us, and claim the water himself. The cost of a pipe line to bring to bring the water of Government Gulch around by way of the County road, and back again to a proper elevation on ground belonging to us, would roughly be about \$14,000. I doubt very much whether it would be worth while to bring it in at such an expense, and think that we would better abandon the claim.

*I figure about 12000 ft. 10" pipe at say \$1 a ft. laid - and about 3000 ft. of flume, & pipe from it to the mill - say \$2000 more. It would cost very little more to pipe the water all the way.*
