On the 27th inst. I appeared by request before the sub-commission on mining, of the Industrial Commission. I had a session of 3 hours with them, and was followed by Dr. France and Joe MacDonald. Yesterday I believe that Bartlett Sinclair and Gov. Steunenberg were to appear before the Commission. The Commission had been pretty well filled up by Sovereign, Dr. Matchette and others of that stamp, and many of the questions put to me indicated a tendency to favor labor organizations. The member of the Commission who examined me was M.D. Ratchford, who, I understand, is the representative of organized labor on the Commission, and perhaps the animus which he seems to have does not extend to the other members. From all I can gather, <sup>the</sup> presentation of our side of the difficulty here has made, on the whole, a favorable impression.
