Dear Sir,-

I have your letter of 31st inst. and note the reference to Dan Burke as a probable witness for the Last Chance people. Dan Burke is the son of John M. Burke. I saw him at the depot a few days ago, and was somewhat surprised. I did not connect him at all with the Last Chance suit. I will notify McBride and Allen of his presence, and <sup>the</sup> probability of his being used as a witness by the Last Chance people. I do not think he can know anything in regard to the early locations in this camp, as he was a mere boy, probably not over 6 or 7 years of age in 1885. It is possible that Miller may be sending him to hunt for Carlin. In regard to Carlin. I have just received a note from Stephens as follows: "As nearly as I can learn at the present writing, there has been a falling out between Carlin and Flaherty. This no doubt caused the former's unexpected advent. However, we are not done for yet". I wrote Stephens today regretting that there had been any hitch in the arrangements with Carlin, and saying that we were, of course, not only willing, but anxious, to carry out our part of the arrangement concerning him, and hoped that he, Carlin, would carry out his part. But that we had done everything we could in the matter, and were unable to offer any additional inducements to keep him in line.
