Dear Sir,

Mr. Porter has surveyed the Oreaha tying it to the Hornet, and I enclose a plat showing the relative positions. Only the 3 stakes on the East end of the Oreaha are standing, & the plat was made by making the side lines parallel to a line from the end center stake through the Discovery point. The S.E. ^{+N.W.} corners could be drawn in and the extra lateral rights would then be as shown by the dotted lines. As you will observe, these rights would cover a small portion of the Hookum ore body, provided that the latter could be proved to be on the same vein as apexes in the Oreaha. The wagon road which crosses the Oreaha ground is about 850 ft. vertically above the level of the K.T., or say about 200 ft. higher than the Sweeney Tunnel. As the horizontal

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distance is over 3000 ft. it can hardly be that the Skookum & Ouaha are on the same vein, although the latter is quite flat.

The workings on the Ouaha, do not permit a definite conclusion to be reached as to the average strike of the vein. You will notice that there is an opening quite near the North side line. It is therefore impossible to say whether the vein does really cross the end lines of the claim or not.
