Breed associations provide beef cattle producers a variety of benefits and services. Breed associations work in the areas of breed promotion, marketing, member education, performance recording, and performance evaluation. While all services are important, one that receives much attention is performance recording and the evaluation of animals.

To remain competitive in the beef cattle industry, producers must continually strive to identify and

retain genetically superior animals for use in future generations. To accomplish this task, producers must take advantage of available tools and resources, such as expected progeny differences (EPD). EPDs are an evaluation of an animal's genetic worth (value as a parent). EPDs are reported in sire summaries, which are published by several breed associations.
