Range cattle being pastured on irrigated permanent pasture in the Weiser Valley in southern Idaho. This Valley produces much of the hay used as supplemental feed for the range land adjacent to it. Stock are carried on the ranges during the summer months and pastured in the valley in the early spring and late fall. During the winter months it is necessary to supply hay for livestock.

Enrollee Clifford Bennett, Amelia, Ohio (on the drill) and Enrollee Frank Lucas, Cambridge Ohio, (cat operator), seeding alfalfa and hay for permanent dry land pasture. This is a retirement of cultivated lands to permanent cover. Enrollee Bennett has learned to operate the drill, making adjustments necessary, and to keep accurate records of the area planted. Under the direction of the camp agronomist he has learned to distinguish and to name all of the seeds of the grasses used in this area. He has progressed in his training until he has ^{been} given complete charge of the seed house. It is his job to mix and weigh all seed and to distribute it to the cooperator's farm. Enrollee Lucas has learned to operate the tractor and keep it in good running order. Bennett is a farm boy and plans to save his money and buy a farm on which he will practice soil conserving measures.
