Just a line regarding the monthly report. As you will notice the academic totals are low as a result of the action of the educational committee deciding not to push class attendance until after the end of the present enrollment period.

What we have lost in this department we have more than gained in the increased interest the overhead have taken in the guidance problems of the men. The attitude of the men toward the taking of tests is changing to one of interest and willingness to take tests when arranged for.

As a result of our decision to include the reading of non fiction magazines as on a par with library books, our reading records have gained rapidly.
