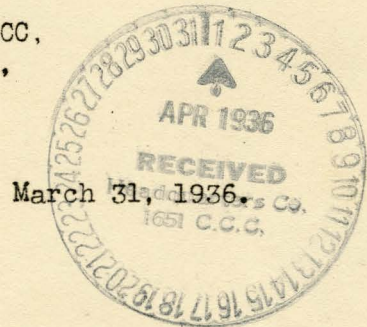

1. Under the provisions of par. 28 a, War Department Regulations, CCC, May 15, 1935, CCC Enrollee STUART W. WRIGHT, CC6-48884, Company 1651, Camp Dent S-279, Ahsahka, Idaho, having been Honorably Discharged, to accept employment, will proceed from Orofino, Idaho on April 1, 1936, to Omaha, Nebraska, the place of his election, being a shorter distance than the place of his selection.

The District Quartermaster will furnish the necessary rail transportation from Orofino, Idaho to Omaha, Nebraska, on Casual Train "B", QMG Routing No. 1256.

The travel directed is necessary in the Public Service and the cost thereof is chargeable to procurement authority FD 1613, P 1-0611, A 5016-57.

2. Pursuant to instructions contained in par. 1, letter HNCA, March 23, 1936, Camp Educational Adviser, H. B. SPALDING, is, effective April 1, 1936, relieved from further duty as Specialist Vocational Training, is assigned to Company 1654, Camp Ahsahka, S-280, as Camp Educational Adviser, and will proceed by first available Government motor transportation, reporting upon arrival to the Commanding Officer thereat for duty.

Since Camp Educational Adviser SPALDING will be put to no additional expense in the performance of this travel the payment of per diem allowances is not authorized.

3. CCC Enrollee CHARLES R. WOODS, CC5-134206, Member of Company 554, Camp Nez Perce SCS-3, Idaho, is, effective this date, transferred to District Headquarters Detachment and will proceed by first available Government motor transportation to Lewiston, Idaho, reporting upon arrival thereat to the Detachment Commander for duty.

4. First Lieut. VICTOR E. LEWIS, QM-Res., accompanied by Assistant Leader EDDIE STENZEL, CC9-145604, Clerk, and CCC Enrollee PHIL CONNOR, CC9-18601, driver of Government passenger car No. 1114, will proceed from Lewiston, Idaho, by Government-owned automobile, on or about April 1, 1936, to Camp Walla Walla, SCS-4, Washington, and Camp Pullman, SCS-2, Washington, for the purpose of inspecting personnel records of enrollees at those camps being discharged at end of Sixth Period for ETS.

Upon completion of these duties, Lieutenant LEWIS, Assistant Leader STENZEL and CCC Enrollee CONNOR, driver of Government passenger car No. 1114, will return to this headquarters.

The travel directed is necessary in the Public Service and the cost thereof is chargeable to procurement authority FD 1609, P 2-0620, A 5016-57, pertaining to the travel of LIEUT. LEWIS.

5. Under the provisions of par. 6 a, (1), AR 605-115, June 30, 1933, leave of absence for twenty (20) days, effective on or about April 9, 1936, is granted First Lieut. RUSSELL C. HINOTE, Cav-Reserve.
