- 2. The following matters are specifically mentioned as being susceptible of improvement;
  - a. Records can be more carefully maintained
- b. The state of discipline is listed as very good. This condition may be easily raised to excellent, by causing the men to acquire the habit of interior police and improvement of quarters. The men can avoid tracking mud and dirt into buildings and tents, if the matter is repeatedly impressed upon them. The neat arrangement of clothing and equipment canb e greatly improved by providing uniform facilities, viz; hangers, lockers, shelving, etc.
- c. Frequent inspections should be made of individual clothing and equipmet in order to check state of repair, care etc. Regulation concerning marking og equipment should be consulted. See P.r. 50 i WDR CCC, 1935.
- d. Repairs of tentage, tools, tent floors, etc, should be promptly attended to, in order that the said property be prevented from becoming unserviceable The length of service of all government property should be prolonged where pratical.
- e. Efforts at beautification of the camp is commended. Also the elimination of mosquitoes, excellent mess, provision for fire fighting; high morale of the men, and extensice welfare activity.
