

McCALL CCC CAMP CONTINUES ACTIVITY

Operation of the McCall CCC camp will not be halted by the quarantine of the camp for the smallpox of one member, said Franklin Girard, state forester, Tuesday.

The camp, which is doing work for the state under direction of the forest office, was quarantined Sunday for smallpox while physicians observed the symptoms of one enrollee, showing all the signs of having smallpox.

"The boys," Girard said, "will continue their usual work for the state on the various projects on which they are engaged. The only difference from the routine will be that casual visitors will be warned away and the boys will not be permitted to mingle in any way with anyone outside the camp. Trips to town are taboo. We don't regard the situation as anything more than a temporary inconvenience for the enrollees."
