The McCall Chamber of Commerce met in an important session Monday night at Goodman's Cafe where members discussed matters pertaining to the golf course, the Payette Lakes highway and the proposed road over Lake Fork creek route that will connect McCall with the South Fork of the Salmon river.

Forest Supervisor H. M. Shank stated that he believed the work on the Lake Fork road would start this summer with two CCC camps working on the project. The work would be under the supervision of the Forest Service. At the meeting Monday night the members heard letters from Senator D. Worth Clark and Congressman Compton I. White stating that they would give their whole hearted assistance to the furthering of the project as it is now outlined. John Sackerman was appointed to

John Sackerman was appointed to contact the Village board and see if it would furnish a right of way and the funds to construct a suitable road from Main street to the outside of the Village limits where the Forest Service road would start.

Construction of this long-planned for road will mean much to the people of McCall and the surrounding country. For many years McCall and Cascade have vied for the patronage and trade from the 'back country' an area along the Salmon River that is almost isolated even during the summer months. The route over the hills and into this section of the country has been long and arduous for many years. It is a roundabout way into this section from either town. The area can be better served with a road over the Lake Fork route than by any other way. The proposed road will shorten the distance by many

Urge New Right Of Way

The last problem considered by the club at the meeting concerned the rerouting and rebuilding of the Payette Lakes highway through Spring Valley, just south of the Horseshoe Bend hill. For a long time this has been a bad section of the road from McCall to Boise and since improvements have been made over the rest of the route special efforts are being made to com-

special efforts are being made to complete this lap and thereby finish a first class highway for the entire distance. The present route has many bad curves and one hard grade and because of those conditions the Federal Government will not give the state department any aid in the oiling and grading of the road. With a new right of way following an easier route Federal aid can be secured and sufficient funds raised to finish the stretch in first class condition. Trouble over the right-of-way is the present obstacle that is receiving the attention of the Long Valley towns, both Cascade and McCall.

Roy May was appointed by the club to see what can be done regarding the matter. In the past years McCall has suffered much because of the conditions of the highway from Boise. It would mean much to McCall if this road could be finished and a good all-weather, surfaced route be maintained at all times.
