

Foresters Attend Fire School Here

Forty potential fire fighters attended the guard training fire school at the Idaho forest office June 1, 2 and 3. Representatives from the Southern Idaho Timber Protective association and from the CCC attended classes under the supervision of Don Romanc and John Nelson of the regional office at Ogden.

A military camp was set up immediately behind the forest office to house the class attendants. Actual demonstrations were given in fire fighting at the old stock yard site.

Classes were held in compass reading determination of the size and point of attack of fires, maintenance of telephone lines and trails, public contact and law enforcement, construction, map reading and orientation of fire fighters, and radio technique. A movie illustrating the technique of fire fighting was shown to the classes and personnel of the Idaho forest Thursday evening.

A similar school was held at Big Creek, June 5, 6 and 7. Supervisor H. M. Shank, Assistant Supervisor Jack Kooch, Fire Technician F. E. Powers, and Radio Technician Darrel J. Iverson attended.
