
IDAHO YOUTHS MAY JOIN CIVILIAN CONSERVATION CORPS

McCall has one of four Civilian Conservation Corps camps in Idaho, reserved for Idaho residents only, which has openings for 198 additional enrollees, it was announced Monday by Franklin Girard, state forester.

The camps are located at Alexander Flats in Blaine county, McCall in Valley county, French Creek in Idaho county and at Heyburn State Park in Kootenai county.

Expressing fear that unless the quotas for the four Idaho camps are filled at this time the total number of camps in the state might be curtailed, Girard pointed out that enrollment dates are from April 17 to April 20. Enrollees must be between the ages of 17 and 24.

Albert Lee, Idaho public assistance commissioner, assured Girard his organization would co-operate in the drive to fill the quotas and through its county agencies would endeavor to reach eligible applicants.
