

Valley Farmers Urged To Increase Production Milk, Eggs, Chickens

Family-type farmers and small operators cooperating in the Valley and Adams Farm Security Administration program are being urged to increase production of milk, chickens, eggs and pork this year to increase their incomes and share in the expanding market for these products resulting from the department of agriculture's "Food for Defense," says Marice V. Sorenson, County FSA supervisor, located in Cascade.

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FSA families can support the "Food for Defense" program with little change in present farm plans or outlay of additional funds, explained Sorenson, through added feeding for sustained egg production and increased milk production, saving their best heifer calves, saving additional pigs for fall breeding or planning additional fall farrowing. Where substantial changes in farm plans are considered, they should be carefully reviewed with the FSA office.
