

# New CCC Camp Moves Into McCall Barracks

McCall's CCC Barracks, vacant since the abandonment of the local CCC camp several weeks ago, was buzzing with activity again this week, when the Lakefork camp took over.

The Lakefork camp moved to the local barracks Tuesday, about a week earlier than was at first anticipated.

The new camp's present strength, however, is 43 enrollees and four officers. Lieutenant Carman is company commander; Vincent Sullivan, sub altern and Stewart McCutcheon, educational adviser. Fred M. Kerby is camp superintendent.

The problem before the camp now is securing of replacements and new enrollees to bring the camp up to a strength of 150, which the govern-

is securing of replacements and new enrollees to bring the camp up to a strength of 150, which the government requires. This is a strict requirement and if the number is not secured in a reasonable length of time, the camp will be disbanded.

To gain this end, the Star has on reliable authority, that the Garden Valley camp of 42 members may be absorbed by the local camp, bringing its strength up to more than 80, although still nearly 70 short of the federal requirement.

Main activity of the local CCC boys this winter will be working east on the Yellow Pine road. Work will start in the vicinity of Blackwell's ranch. The initial grade is mostly in now, and the local camp will carry-on with blasting and clearing during the winter months.

Lieutenant Carman pointed out that this camp is the only one in the district equipped for training adzmen. This is a 3-months course and in as much as the government wants 2,000 adzmen, those completing the course are guaranteed jobs.

This Lakefork camp which moved to McCall Tuesday ordinarily moves to French Creek (Riggins.) There will be no camp there this year.
