tion to the enemy and it has been definitely proven that these Japs have armed themselves so they would be in position to go much further toward harming us when the time was ripe.

So far the only effort toward protecting ourselves has been made by the F.B.I. which has rounded up a few Japs here and there and put them where they could not harm us. This is no criticism of the F.B.I. It is doing a swell job for a small outfit. What should be done, in our opinion, is to take a much larger organization and MOVE ALL OF THESE JAPS AWAY FROM OUR VITAL AREAS-AND MOVE THEM NOW. If and when a part of them could PROVE that they were good and loyal citizens of the U.S. A. they could be allowed to go as they pleased. If, on the other hand, we leave even one of JAPAN'S loyal subjects where he can harm us it would be possible for him to fix things so that it might be very inconvenient or even impossible for us to come and go as we pleased for a long time.
