The Donnelly Farm Security Labor Camp is scheduled to open within a few days on the Orville Hamilton place, one mile south of Donnelly, according to an announcement today of Thomas D. Sherrard, Farm Security Camp Manager, who is here making advance arrangements. Facilities for several hundred families and single workers needed to harvest the peas, carrots, potatoes and other crops in this area will be provided by the camp.

"We are cooperating with the farm placement service to provide adequate living quarters for harvest labor and are making special efforts to assure supervision of the younger people, providing them with healthy opportunities for recreation, education, and religious expression."
