According to reports, indications point toward the early passage by Congress of the "Black 30-hour work week" bill which would restrict the hours of labor in mines, factories, quarries, mills, etc., to a minimum of 5 days per week and 6 hours per day, thus making more jobs and putting millions of idle citizens again at work.

The new law would not affect farms or railroads and exemptions to newspapers and periodicals and all branches of industry affecting perishables are expected.

250,000 Men Soon To Be At Work In Forests

Government departments have been speeded up to carry out President Roosevelt's forest program for furnishing employment for 250,000 idle men. It is expected that the move to the forest camps will be started in about two weeks. Army officers will be in charge of recruiting the men, and young, able bodied men with dependents will be the first chosen.

The pay of the men will probably be \$30 per month and keep.

Officials think Idaho can give employment to about 12,000 men who will be enrolled for a six-months period.
