## NOTICE OF ELECTION PRECINCTS AND REGISTRARS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN Pursuant to the Provisions of Article 220, Idaho Session Laws, for the year 1931, that voting precincts have been established and registrars appointed therefore within the County of Valley, State of Idaho, for the Constitutional Election to be held September 19, 1933, as follows:

### Lake Precinct

Registrar, Mrs. A. A. Good McCall, Idaho.

This precinct shall include school district numbers Independent No. 2, 49, Consolidated 3, 4 and 58, and that portion of District No. 53, lying north of Township line between Townships 17 and 18 North.

### Roseberry Precinct

Registrar, Ralph McDougall, Idaho.

This precinct shall include school district numbers 5, 26, 45 and that portion of School District No. 53 lying South of the township line between Townships 18 North and all that portion of School Districts No. 31 and 4 North of the Township line between Townships 15 and 16 North.

### Arling Precinct

Registrar, F. B. Goode, Idaho.

This precinct shall include school districts 15 North, Ranges 2, 3, 4 and 5 East of the Boise Meridian.

### Cascade Precinct

Registrar, Mrs. R. P. Johnson, Cascade, Idaho.

This precinct shall include School District No. 15, that portion of school districts numbers 19 lying South of the Township line between Townships 14 and 15 North, all of Independent School District No. 1, that portion of School District No. 2 lying North of Big Creek, that portion of School District No. 3 lying South of the range line between Townships 15 and 16 North.

### Alpha Precinct

Registrar, Mrs. U. E. Johnson, Idaho.
