Fifty-two Highway Pro- jects Underway In Idaho, Report

Fifty-two highway projects of various types, totaling about three million dollars, are now in progress in Idaho, all but three having been let since July 1, announced J. H. Stemmer, director of highways, Wednesday.

One project got under way Wednesday, when Ralph Davis of La Grande, Ore., was awarded the contract for construction of a highway between Old Meadows and New Meadows, at a bid of \$59,000.

Of the 52 projects nine are under the supervision of the forest service. Ten are being built with 1932 emergency federal aid funds. Fourteen are day labor projects. Six are bridge jobs.

Two more day labor projects, one in Benewah and one in Boundary counties, will get under way Monday next.

The bureau Wednesday called for bids on construction of a 175-foot bridge over Big Wood river between Ketchum and Hailey, bids to be opened October 27.
