Civil Works Program Brings Huge Payroll To Idaho

Governor Ross said Sunday night that the civil works program is pouring wages into Idaho at the rate of \$760,000 a month.

About \$700,000 of this amount is being paid to the 10,000 or more laborers and 1,100 teams belonging in the main part to farmers.

"That is a lot of money going into circulation in this state," the Governor said.

Nearly the entire quota of men of the state are at work, he said, on jobs on city streets and country roads, in parks and other work.

Hundreds of dozens of shovels picks and other hand impliments are being brought to supply the crews at work in the field, a carload of dynamite being purchased to be used in the vicinity of Lewiston. The men are receiving 55 cents an hour for 130 hours a month.
