## LOCAL CIVIL WORKS PROGRAM NOW EMPLOYING NEARLY A HUNDRED MEN

The Valley County Civil Works program is now going forward nicely considering the weather conditions, with ninety-five men at work.

At McCall, graveling is going on between town and the Elo district and a crew of men are at work on the airport.

The road is being graveled between Donnelly and Roseberry and a crew is at work on the Donnelly High School gymnasium.

Graveling is being carried on in the Beaver Meadows section and a crew of eleven men are working on bridge projects in Round Valley. Graveling is also being done in the Thunder City section.

At Cascade a crew of men are at work on the airport, graveling, tearing down the rail fencing and putting up wire fences to eliminate the heavy snow drifting. Snow fences will also be built.

Last Wednesday saw the first pay day under the C. W. P. with a payroll of \$1,821.65 and another pay day is scheduled for Saturday.

H. L. Buck of McCall has been appointed paymaster and it is expected that there will be no further delays.

## THE AGRICULTURE OUTLOOK FOR

### FARMER'S INCOME TO THROUGH BENEFIT

Farm prices, costs of production and retail prices do not compare. Especially is there a disparity during periods of depression. The unfavorable relation of farm prices to prices farmers pay for commodities they buy has existed since the post-war deflation of 1920. This has worked a hardship on the agricultural producer. This spread was widest in 1932 when 49 percent of pre-war agricultural prices were 10 percent of pre-war. The new deal agriculture proposes to raise the purchasing power of the farmer to pre-war parity by: (1) increasing the general price level; (2) increasing the prices paid for agricultural products by the reduction of agricultural taxes; (3) increasing the farm income through benefit payments.

Agricultural credit will be advanced through a variety of enlarged sources of funds available under the farm credit administration.
