WAR VETERANS MAY NOW ENROLL IN CIVILIAN CONSERVATION CORPS

There will be an opportunity for enrollment of a limited number of Idaho World War and Spanish-American war veterans in the veterans contingent of the Civilian Conservation Corps between Jan. 2 and Jan. 10, 1934, according to a statement just released by C. H. Huddelson, Manager, Veterans' Administration Facility, Boise.

The number of ex-service men to

be enrolled in the Civilian Conservation camps is dependent on the number of vacancies existing in the various veterans' camps now located in California. All veterans who are enrolled will be sent to fill the vacancies in camps near Sascamento and Redding.
