Fewer CCC Camps For Idaho This Summer; Relief Crew Cut

According to report from Wash-
ington, Idaho and other western
states will have fewer CCC Camps
during the coming summer than they
had last year, it having been decid-
ed this year not to ship great num-
bers of young men from the east to
western states.

Instead of the 80 camps which
Idaho had last year, the report stat-
ed, the number will be greatly re-
duced as only Idaho men will be
used. However, the Forest Service
hopes to keep most of its forest
camps in an effort to control the
blister rust evil.

Parker C. Carver, CWA Adminis-
trator for Idaho announced Tuesday
that Idaho's CWA workers will be
reduced to 8000 by April first, the
cutting program to start March 9th
and the reductions to be 1500 men
week. Previously an order cutting
the workers from about 22,000 to
14,000 was ordered to take place by
March 2. The new order will elim-
inate an additional 5400 men.
