IMPORTANT NEWS EVENTS OF WEEK

19 STATES HAVE NOW RATI-FIED REPEAL AMENDMENT

With Arkansas, Alabama and Tennessee having ratified the amendment to repeal the Volstead law during the past week the total number of state having ratified to the present date has grown to 19. The average total percentage of votes so far have been about 4 to 1 for repeal and no state has yet voted against repeal.

Favorable action by 36 states is necessary to repeal the Volstead law.

Idaho Gets 4 Million From Federal Public Works Fund

Word has been received from Washington that Idaho has been allocated approximately four and a half million dolars from the federal public works fund, to be used mostly for highway work. Valley County's allocation amounts to \$335,000 which will mostly be used to complete the overhead crossing of the railroad at the Van Wyck bridge.
