IMPORTANT NEWS EVENTS OF WEEK

19 STATES HAVE NOW RATI- FIED REPEAL AMENDMENT

With Arkansas, Alabama and Ten-
nessee having ratified the amend-
ment to repeal the Volstead law dur-
ing the past week the total number
of state having ratified to the pres-
ent date has grown to 19. The aver-
age total percentage of votes so far
have been about 4 to 1 for repeal and
no state has yet voted against repeal.

Favorable action by 36 states is
necessary to repeal the Volstead
law.

Idaho Gets 4 Million From Federal Public Works Fund

Word has been received from
Washington that Idaho has been al-
located approximately four and a
half million dollars from the federal
public works fund, to be used most-
ly for highway work. Valley Coun-
ty's allocation amounts to \$335,000
which will mostly be used to com-
plete the overhead crossing of the
railroad at the Van Wyck bridge.
Building of the bridges across the
Payette river below Cascade and a-
bove Smith's Ferry, and construction
of the remaining unfinished section
of the Payette Highway from Cas-
cade into Round Valley.
