

# Fire Hazard Grows As Season Advances; 38 Local Fires

The woods in the Payette Forest are becoming dryer each day and consequently the fire hazard is growing apace. A lightning storm Thursday night set a number of fires but all were gotten under control before any great damage was done.

The big Sulphur Creek fire which started a week ago is now under control after burning over an area of 1200 acres. 125 men were used in combatting this blaze and 50 men are now patrolling the fire lines.

The Tyndal Meadows fire near Deadwood summit which burned over an area of 250 acres is also under control with 25 men on guard.

The Payette Forest has had 38 fires to-date this season, the two before mentioned being the only ones of any consequence.

A fire started in an old Boise Payette cutting east of Arling Thursday afternoon and traveled south about 3 miles in a very short time. It is being fought by the Southern Idaho Timber Protective association in charge of Floyd Fry. About 75 men, part of them CCC boys from McCall, are on the fire lines and appear to have it under control at this time.
