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## Ross Receives $\$ 405,500$ For Idaho Relief

Governor Ross announced late Thursday night that a reclassification of some 27,000 cases on the Idaho emergency relief administration rolls has resulted in a reduction of from " 20 to 30 per cent in the number of cases," and that he Thursday received $\$ 405,500$ for Idaho rellef purposes in February.

The Governor said checks to the counties were being malled out Thursday night.

He credited the citizens' committees he recently ordered appointed with the responsibility for removal of many persons not in dire need from IERA rolls.

A recheck that is now being made by the committees may show, he said, that some of the cases removed may have to be returned.
"We will be able to provide adequately for the needy of this state," he stated.

Of the funds received Thursday from Washington, D. C., $\$ 116,500$ was for direct relief; $\$ 250,000$ was for drouth rellef project workers and $\$ 38,000$ was for transient relief, he said.

Some work relief project, other than drouth, will be started during the coming week, he announced. A number of drouth projects will resume work tomorrow.

The work of reorganization is going on slowly, he noted, expressing the hope that he soon would be able to present a practicable plan that could be carried out without inter-ruption.-Statesman.
