

IERA CLOSES PROJECTS AND URGES MEN TO TAKE PRIVATE JOBS

In an effort to provide labor in southwestern Idaho counties, IERA officials Wednesday ordered a general shutdown all but emergency relief projects.

No relief worker who accepts temporary or seasonable employment will be penalized in any sense of the word, but if it is definitely established that an able-bodied man has refused work, he will be removed from the relief rolls, according to a statement issued from the IERA office.

"Realizing the need for workers in the fields in order that Idaho's crops may be harvested without loss to growers, the IERA is determined to cut of the relief rolls any able-bodied man who has been offered a job by the national re-employment service and who refuses to accept this offer of employment.

IDAHO NRA ACT WILL BE PER- MITTED TO DIE

Idaho's State recovery act, which passed by the last legislature will without doubt die of inaction.

It was learned Tuesday that Governor Ross has decided upon the advice of the attorney general that the Supreme Court decision invalidating the NRA also makes the Idaho law invalid. The state law adopted the NRA national codes as the codes for state industries.
