

GOVERNMENT RELIEF FUNDS FOR IDAHO TOTAL OVER A MILLION

Grants of Government funds totaling \$1,392,278 have been made thus far by the Federal Emergency Relief Administration for the relief of needy persons in the State of Idaho.

In addition, the FERA, headed by Harry L. Hopkins, Administrator, began to function on May 22, 1933. Seven days later, the first relief grant of \$137,627 was made to Idaho. Since that time, the State has been given additional amounts, from time to time, aggregating \$1,218,651.

The fuel and foodstuffs were given through the Federal Surplus Relief Corporation, of which Mr. Hopkins is President, and included 1,503,611 pounds of food products and 3,724 tons of coal. Relief in the form of 7,200 blankets was also extended.

The foodstuffs consisted of 107,784 pounds of canned beef; 930,071 pounds of pork; 80,064 pounds of cereal food; 139,356 pounds of flour; 44,010 pounds of lard; 177,326 pounds of butter; 25,000 pounds of cheese; and 80,064 pounds of milk wheato.
