ENROLLMENT OF VETERANS IN C C CORPS WILL CONTINUE TO AUGUST 20

Enrollment of World War and Spanish-American war veterans in the Civilian Conservation Corps will continue in Idaho to August 20, 1935, in order to fill the quota set for the state of Idaho, according to a statement just released by Homer Hudelson, Manager of the Veterans' Administration at Boise.

The quota for Idaho of World War and Spanish-American war veterans is 124. Since June 15th 48 veterans have been enrolled in the Civilian Conservation Corps. There remains in the quota 76 veterans to be enrolled.

To be eligible for enrollment veterans are required to submit a statement that they are on relief from a relief agency or agree to allot at least three-fourths of their base pay of \$30 a month toward the support of their dependents who are on relief.

Application blanks for enrollment in the Civilian Conservation Corps may be secured from the Veterans' Administration in Boise.
