IDAHO OFFICIALS OUTLINE WORK PROGRAM

Nearly a hundred of the men and
women who will have charge of the
responsible work of administering
Idaho's work relief program, and
thus putting an end to the unemploy-
ment situation, gathered at the Ho-
tel Boise Thursday for a state wide
conference to go over their duties.

Governor Ross opened the meeting
with a word of welcome, impress-
ing the workers with the importance
of their task to the well being of the
state and the future prosperity of
the nation. J. Leo Hood, WPA direc-
tor for Idaho, came next and intro-
duced briefly Mr. Aalan Johnstone,
personal representative of the WPA
office in Washington. He outlined
at length what the duties of the WPA
in Idaho would be, the methods of
procedure, the things to look for in
projects—where to place the em-
phasis, in other words, the need for
haste but the even greater need that
this haste should not result in start-
ing wasteful projects which would
throw away government money with-
out any commensurate return in re-
ducing the unemployment load.
