Federal Cash To Assist Idaho In Highway Program

With \$6,620,000 to spend on various kinds of road work, Joe H. Stemmer, director of highways, said Monday the expansion of his program would be limited only by two factors—the ability of the engineers to design projects and get them accepted; and the ability of county commissioners to get rights of way.

At present, Stemmer said, some 3000 men are working on roads all over the state, the largest number since the fall of 1933, when he had 3500 men at work. He expects to expand this figure rapidly during the fall. Of the total 1200 are directly on the state payroll, where the bureau is spending 100 thousand dollars a month on maintenance; reconstruction and oiling and the remainder are working on private jobs.

Contracts totaling two million dollars are now under way.

The money available falls into three main classes, Stemmer said. In addition to \$250,000 from the Hayden-Cartwright act left over from last year he is spending:

From federal aid funds (which must be matched up to 40 per cent from state funds), \$2,500,000.

From WPA funds, \$2,200,000.

From funds for grade crossing elimination, \$1,649,000.
