

# IERA Projects To Close Saturday; WPA To Take Charge

All works relief projects that have been operating under the Idaho emergency relief administration will be permanently closed Saturday, but relief will continue to be provided by the IERA during November, it was stated Thursday night by A. W. Jacomini, assistant IERA administrator.

Earlier in the day, Jacomini announced that the federal government had allocated \$307,000 to the IERA for relief purposes during November. To this sum will be added \$100,000 by the state, he said, to bring the November funds up to the same amount as was available for October.

"The decision to close all works projects," Jacomini said, "was reached in order to make it possible for all employables in the state to file applications through the national re-employment service for jobs with the works progress administration.

"Our works program has been carried on under the assumption that the WPA would in time take over the employables on our list. That time has come and the WPA is now opening up enough projects to lift the burden of relief from the IERA and forever close the employable list.
