The new relief organization works directly under Governor Ross and is responsible to him. It will handle only a small part of the work formerly taken care of through the IERA. The administrative force throughout the state will be cut down by 350 employees. At present their work will consist of handling relief for those unable to work, certifying to the federal organization those eligible for WPA employment and resettlement assistance, and acting as the selective agency for CCC camps enlistments.

Under present plans the federal government will provide work for all men capable of working, through the WPA, which will hire men and put them to work just as a contractor might, while the state will be charged with the care of the aged, the infirm and the indigent.

Idaho's "unemployable needy," whose direct financial assistance from the federal government ceased Saturday night, will continue to receive food supplies from the federal surplus commodity corporation, W. W. Godfrey, state director announced.

"The food problem will be taken care of for this group, just as in the past," Godfrey said, "but the federal funds that have been available for direct financial grants are no longer available."
