

## 600 Jobs Open On Idaho Market Roads

Employment of 600 men on mine-to-market roads in Idaho forests was approved Tuesday by a committee of foresters and state officials and recommended as a state WPA project. The proposal was referred to the national WPA office in Washington.

Three hundred men would be employed north of the Salmon river and 300 south of the Salmon river, according to plans worked out by Compton L. White, Idaho congressional representative from Clarks Fork. Camps would be established for year-around work on comparatively short stretches of road from isolated mining districts to main highways.

"This is a program that will do infinite good to the state's natural resources," said White. "Development of resources is needed. This would bring that about to a great extent, and at the same time afford employment for a considerable number of men. I have favored such a plan for some time and will continue to work on it in congress."

Attending the conference were J. L. Hood, state administrator of WPA; R. H. Rutledge of Ogden, regional forester, and Evan Keller, regional forester of the Missoula district, which includes northern Idaho.
