TOTAL OF UNEMPLOYED IN IDAHO REDUCED BY 815 IN FEB.

Combined placements by the National Reemployment Service and the State Employment Service in Idaho during the month of February, reduced the total of unemployed by 815, according to information received by W. T. Lockwood, State Director for the National Emergency Council.

Of this number 520 persons were absorbed by private industry.

For the first time since the existence of the National Reemployment Service the National total of persons receiving positions in private employment exceed the total of public replacements and assignments on relief work. Despite the short month 250,249 placements were made, of which 158,013 were in private employ. The gain noted in February over the same period a year ago was 223.8 per cent.
