JOBS AND JOBS OPEN IN THE PEA HARVEST IN LONG VALLEY

According to a report in a recent issue of the Statesman 2000 pea pickers must be recruited for the pea fields in the section just south of McCall by the end of the coming week or the gates may be opened to Mexican and Phillipino labor from northern California.

Peas in this section are ripening fast and must be cared for immediately or prime qualities will be lost. The prevailing scale is 75 cents per 100 pounds with a bouns of 10 cents per 100 pounds if the picker stays to the end of the job.

Opportunity is offered for all local labor, both men, women and children, and if you don't get in on this work outside labor will have to be imported. Board is provided by the growers. Workers need camp equipment.

It is hoped that a repetition of the condition in the Payette and Parma pea fields will be averted. Importation of a thousand workers was necessary in that district.
