W.P.A. Work Starts Monday On City Street

Valley county's newest P.W.A. project will get under way Monday when Cascade will begin making improvements on the Crawford road.

The work will consist mainly in grading and draining the right of way from the highway intersection to the city line, Mayor A. D. Robb stated yesterday. All the men employed will be local men selected from those who are in need, Mr. Robb added.

The project as planned has been on the city docket for some time, along with several other projects of the same nature. The road between Cascade and the Crawford ranger station has long been in need of repair, particularly that section that is within the municipal boundaries.

As much of the work as possible will be completed this winter, depending somewhat on the prevailing weather conditions and the remainder will be done when things open up in the spring. From 8 to 10 men will be employed it was learned.
