

ELECTRICITY WILL SHUT OFF IN CASCADE FOR 24 HOURS

People of Cascade will be without electricity for possibly 24 hours some time next week, according to Lee Murphy, manager of the West Coast Power company.

Due to turbine trouble it will be necessary to shut down for an indefinite length of time, for inspection or repair. The shut down will probably occur either on Monday or Tuesday, Mr. Murphy adds.

This is the first time in 13 years that it has been necessary to shut down this type of repair.

Grazier Needed for This District

The United States Civil Service Commission announces an open competitive examination for the position of Junior Grazier Aid, \$1,500 a year. FOREST PLANS IMPROVEMENT AT WARM LAKE

The Warm Lake vicinity is due for a lot of "fixin' up" this year, according to plans now being inaugurated by the forest department.

Gallagher's CCC camp, composed of 170 men, is all set to move to Warm Lake June 1, and commence work. Already an advance contingent of 25 men and officers have gone in and are setting up tents and making other preparations for the arrival of the Company.

The entire summer, forest officials said, will be devoted to improving the recreation facilities at Warm Lake, and on some road improvement there. In this connection the CCC will complete the construction of the Boy Scout shelters, started last year.

Road construction, officials said, will be confined mostly to about a five mile section on the Middle Fork of the Payette road, widening of part of it and building on toward Blue Point lookout, which is the objective.

Considerable work will be done toward developing the picnic ground right at Warm Lake, at what was originally known as Hotel Point. This area is just east of the cabin owned by Forrest Robb of this city. A great many new tables and grills will be erected on the site.

Another fine improvement which will be completed this summer will be the extending of the pipe line to serve all lots on the lake. The boys will also develop numerous small camp grounds on the South Fork of the Salmon River water shed.

Cecil Engleman, of the forest service, will be camp superintendent and will supervise all of the work done at Warm Lake this year. It is expected that the camp will remain there until some time in October.
