# U. S. Taking Steps On Salmon Problem

Fishermen, white and Indian alike who have lived for generations off the king of the rivers — the royal chinook salmon — revealed fears this week the great spring salmon run had vanished from the Columbit river according to an Associated Press dispatch.

Above Bonneville dam, the government's 55 million dallar power and navigation project, the Indians at picturesque Celilo falls looked at their empty nets and agreed dejectedly, with Sam Starr: "Once we used to catch about six tons a year; last year we didn't do so good; this year there are no fish."

Downstream at Astoria, home of a great fishing fleet and a 10 million dollar industry, gillnetters began racking their tackle. Canneries curtailed operations. The horde of fish had diminisher greatly and from 200 to 500 trollers sought other fishing grounds.

For years William L. Finley, noted naturalist has predicted destruction of the spring run. People are just realizing, he said, that for 40 years the spring run had been falling off.

"The fish are getting by at Bonneville dam, he said. "The government did good work in the seven million dollars spent there for fish ladders by which the salmon pass the dam through a series of lifts and water falls."

On the other hand, Finley said, one of the greatest obstacles is gigantic Grand Coulee dam farther upstream so high that no fish can be laddered beyond it to the natural spawning grounds that lay above.

Besides compulsory ditch screening and less commercial fishing, a solution, says Finley, may be to discard plans to dam the Willamette, Columbia tributary, and permit fish normally running to Columbia headwaters to turn to the Willamette.
