Idahoans Elect Republican For Their Governor

**WHITEHEAD, ON REPUB-
LICAN TICKET ALSO RIDES
IN WITH BOTTOLFSEN**

Boise (AP)—Idaho voters scratched their ballots in the 1938 general election this week to send into the statehouse a republican governor and lieutenant governor and democratic officials for the six other elective state jobs.

They chose one republican and one democratic representative in congress and named conservative democratic Congressman D. Worth Clark as their United States senator to succeed James P. Pope, ardent New Dealer.

The senatorial seat occupied for 32 years by William E. Borah, independent republican, was not at stake.

Republican C. A. Bottolfsen, Arco and Blackfoot newspaper man, boosted the margin over his democratic gubernatorial opponent, former governor C. Ben Ross, to nearly 30,000 votes as returns were tabulated from virtually all precincts.

Bottolfsen was ahead in all but six of Idaho's 44 counties, with Ross polling majorities in Idaho, Latah, Lewis, Madison, Nez Perce and Shoshone counties.

With 754 of the state's 809 precincts reported, Bottolfsen had 103,223 to Ross' 74,926 and 732 for R. B. Wilson of Emmett, progressive.
