# Work Begins On 63 Idaho PWA Projects

Portland, Ore., Dec. 30—Breaking all records for speed in putting men to work on useful construction, the 1938 public works program in Idaho, calling for expenditures of approximately \$3,806,000 for payrolls, materials and other building costs during the next 18 months, will swing into full stride tomorrow with dirt flying on 63 projects, Administrator Harold L. Ickes was informed today by Regional Director C. C. Hockley.

By successfully meeting the January 1 construction deadline set by Congress, Idaho communities will begin the new year with a well-rounded program of projects which will create approximately 3,800,000 man-hours of employment on construction sites and in private industry, Director Hockley stated.

At the close of business on December 27, work already was under way or bids had been opened preparatory to awarding contracts on all but one Idaho project, the regional office reported. The remaining projects were scheduled to go into construction by tomorrow.

Idaho communities participating in the PWA program by contributing 55 per cent of the cost have indicated their need and desire for a wide variety of public works projects which will provide employment at standard wages and tend to satisfy the social needs of the people, Director Hockley said.
